

VENUE MAP





WHAT WORKSHOPS ARE ON FIRST?

PERFORMANCE AND REPORTING WORKSHOP

Public sector organisations are very good at gathering data, but how much use do we actually make of it? How can we use the data we collect to inform and develop our processes? In this workshop we will explore some simple data analysis that can help us learn and understand what is actually important. Data is for performance information, not just for reports! This workshop will be led by Simon Williams, Programme and Change Manager (Performance).



ARCH NEEDS ASSESSMENT

Introduced by Dr Michael Thomas (Public Health Consultant in Public Health Medicine), this session involves Llyr Lloyd (Principal Public Health Practitioner) outlining key findings from the ARCH Health Needs Assessment, causal factors and a range of conditions. Given the raft of possibilities for acting preventatively, participants will consider what impact they, their organisations, and acting collectively – can make on the issue.




DEMENTIA WORKSHOP

The West Wales Regional Dementia Strategy was launched in 2023. CAPITAL WORKSHOP

Andrew manages the regional capital programme, supported by a small programme office, who are tasked with supporting RPB partners with the delivery of a new ten-year Regional Capital Strategy.



The workshop will focus on the need for the West Wales region to define its blueprint for health and social care community hubs, building on the objectives of the Integration and Rebalancing Capital Fund.

Discussions will explore what do we mean by a blueprint for community hubs and the need to build on the key principles outlined for capital developments in the region.
