A strategy is what needs to be done.

What is advocacy?

Advocacy means getting support from another person to help you say your needs and wishes and stand up for your rights.

The Wellbeing of Future Generations Act says people should be able to say:

- My voice is heard and listened to.
- My individual circumstances are considered.
- I speak for myself and contribute to the decisions that affect my life, or have someone who can do it for me.

There are lots of different sorts of advocacy.




Self-advocacy is people speaking up for themselves.
Informal advocacy is when friends or family support you.
Peer advocacy is support from someone who has gone through the same things as you.

Citizen advocacy is working with a trained volunteer advocate.
Formal advocacy means when social workers or staff speak up for people as part of their job.
Other sorts of advocacy are often for groups like disability or older people.
Independent Professional advocacy is a trained advocate working 1:1 on an issue.
Independent Mental Health advocacy is to help people
get their voices heard about their mental health treatment.







Commissioning means councils or the health board choose another organisation to provide advocacy and pay them.

What are outcomes?


Ways to show what an advocacy service has done – like numbers of people helped, or if people are happy with results.
