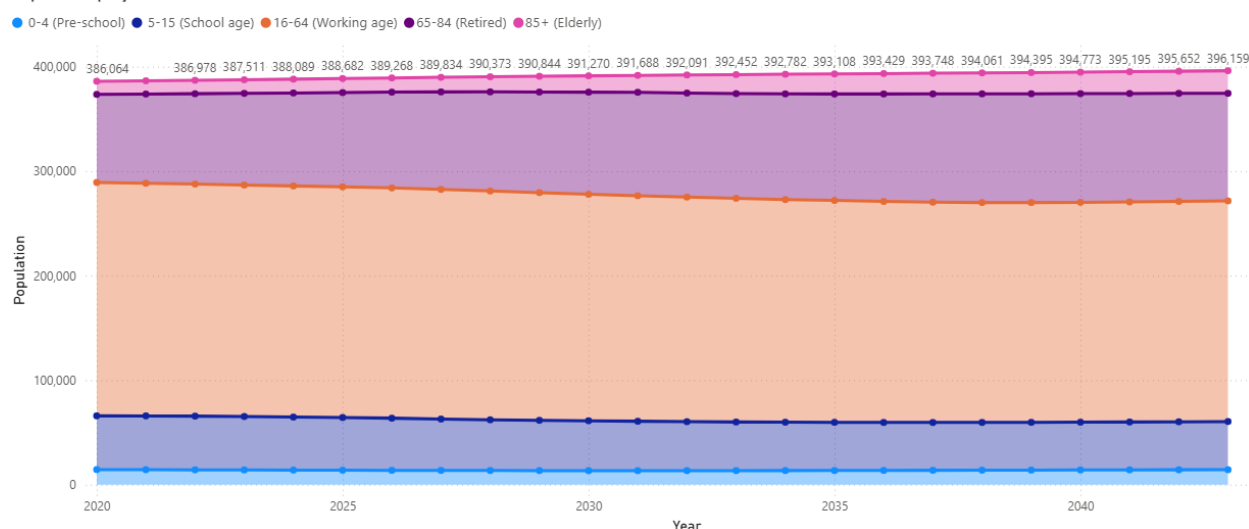

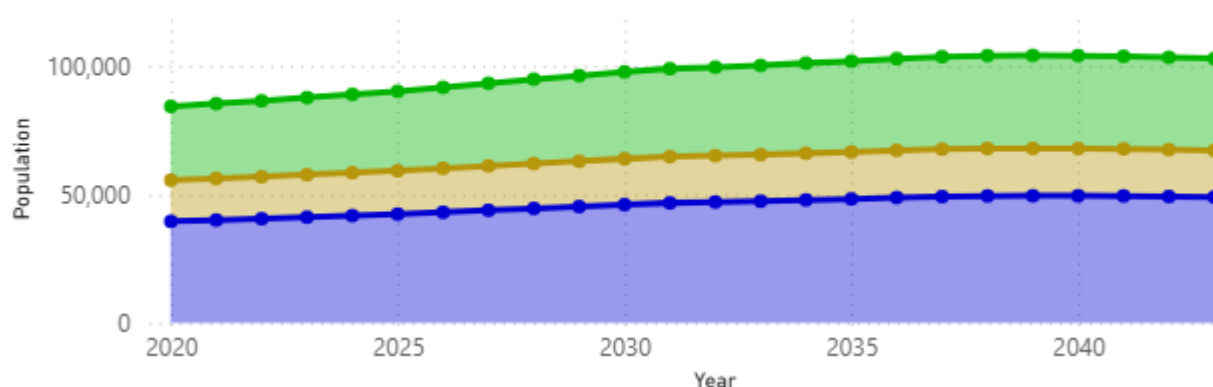

Population projections Retired (65-84)

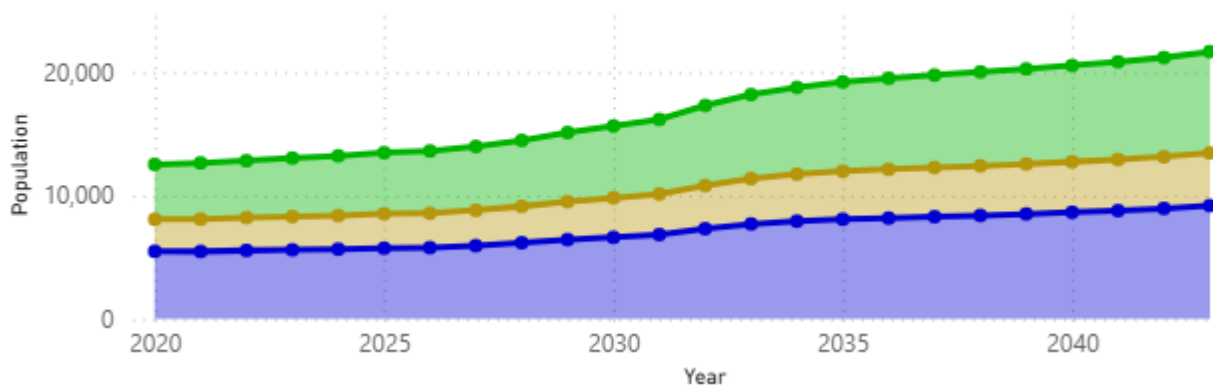

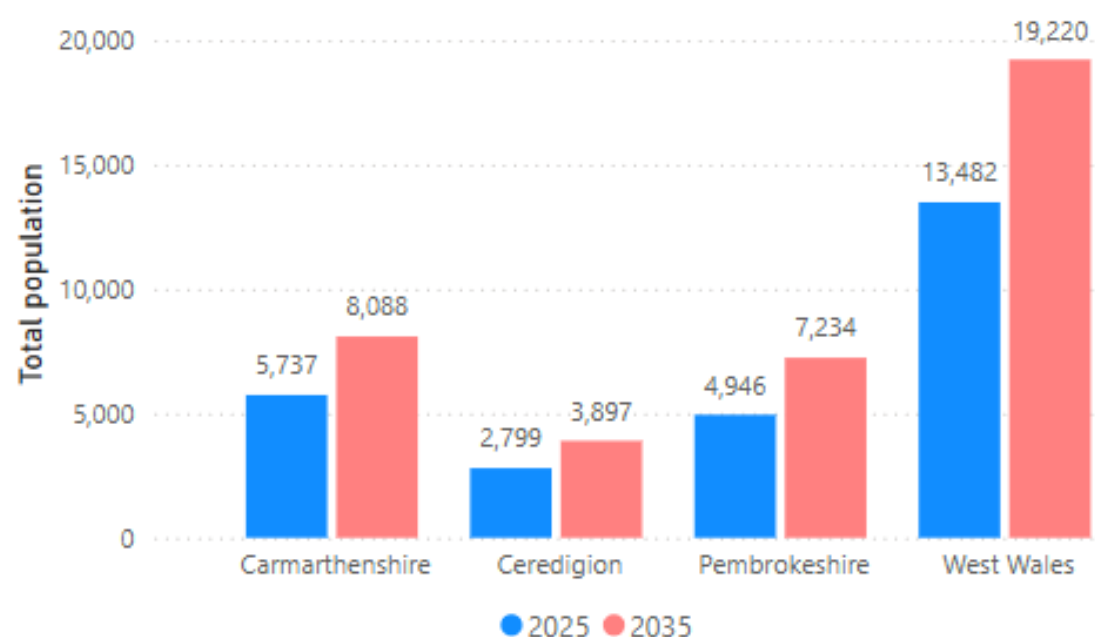

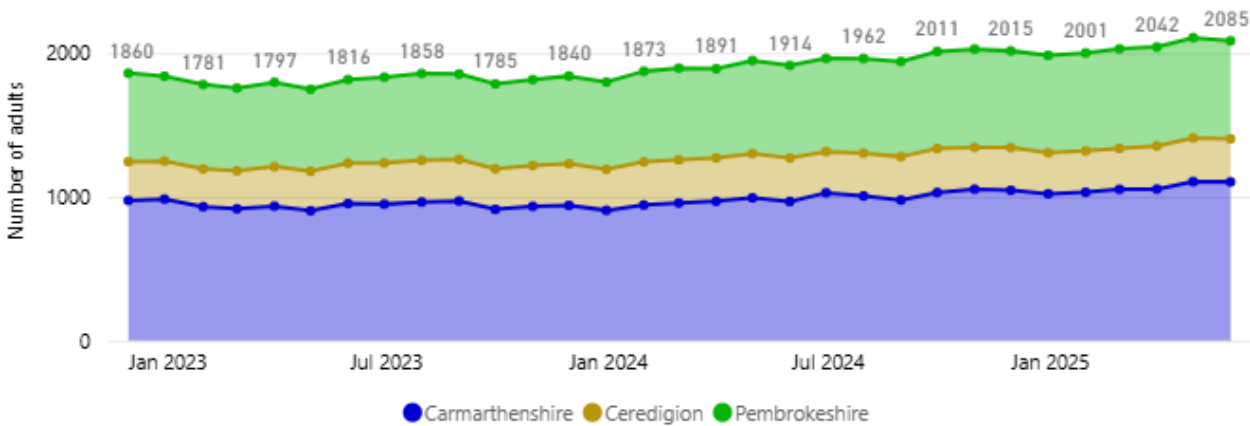

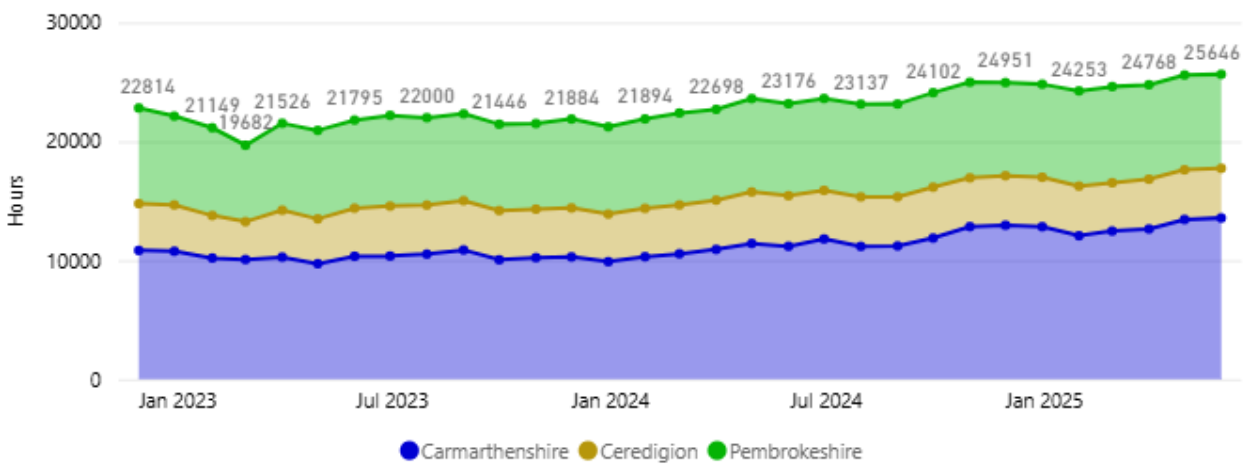

Weekly hours of domiciliary care provided for adults by local authority



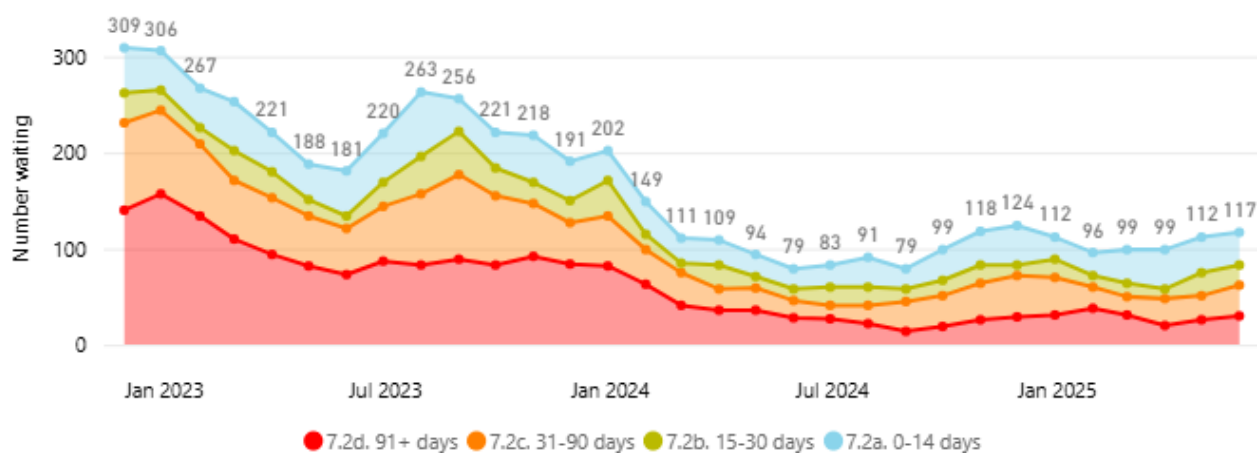

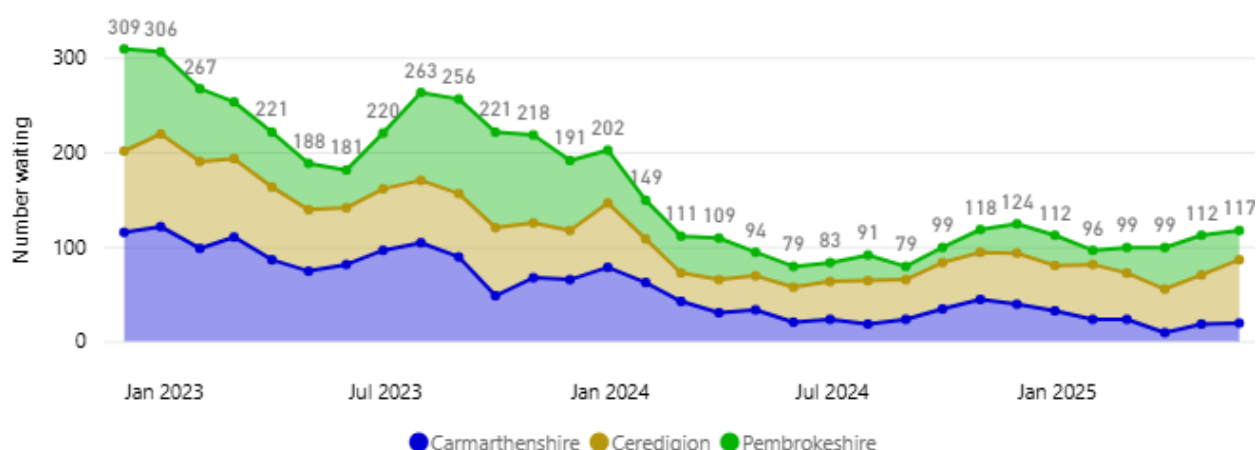

Number of adults waiting for domiciliary care by local authority



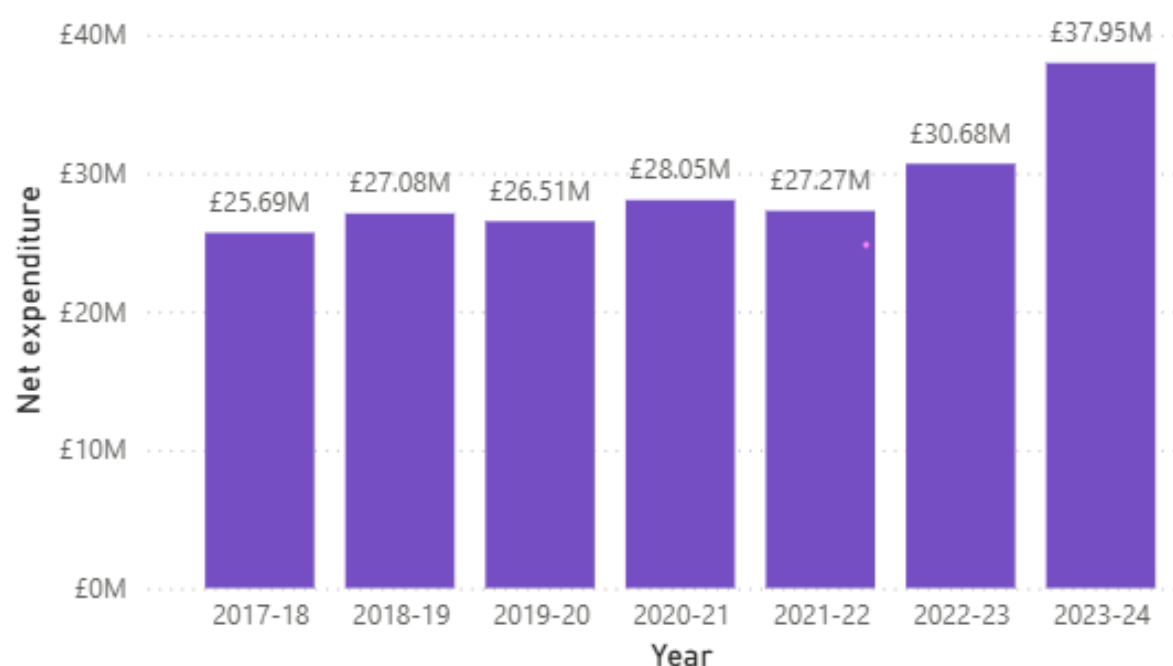

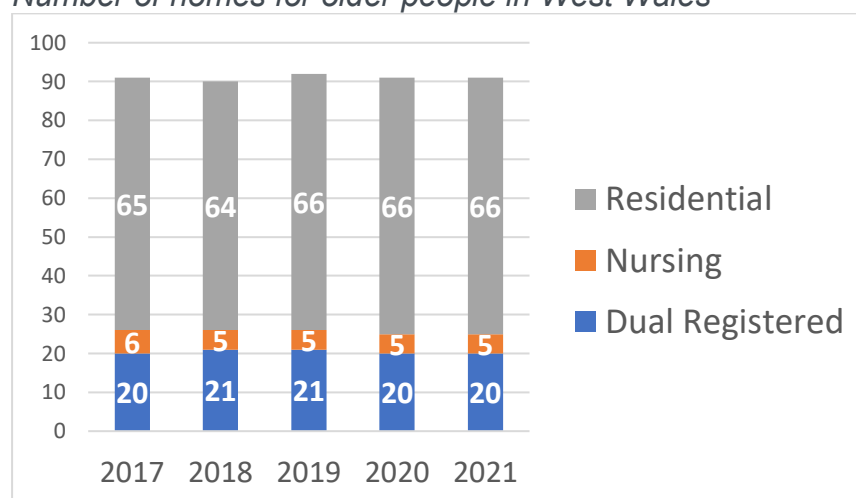
Net expenditure on domiciliary care for older people

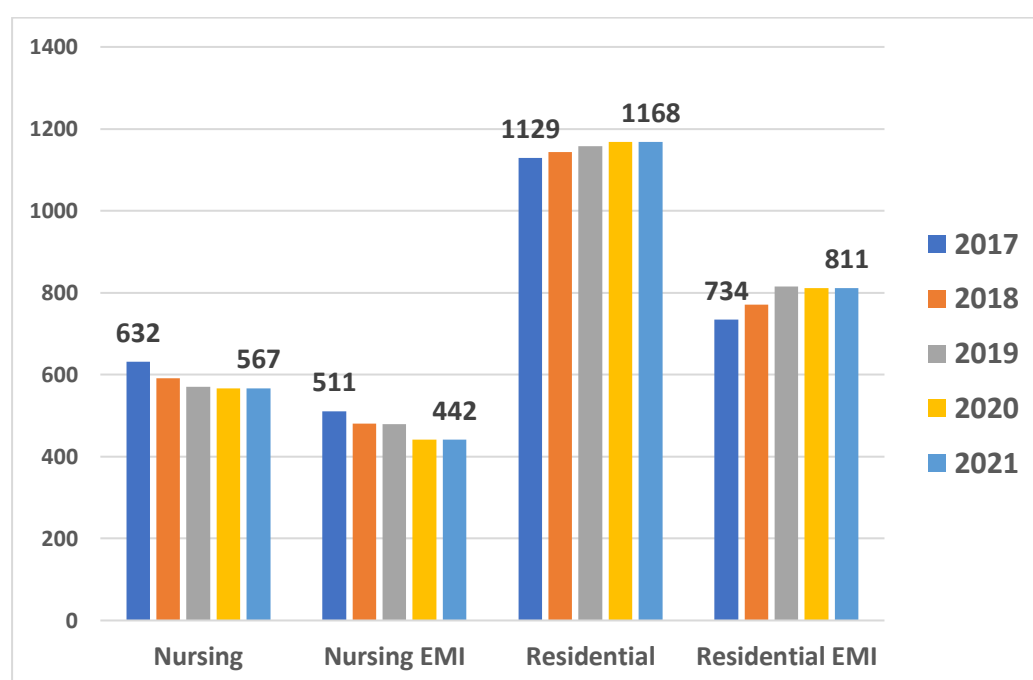

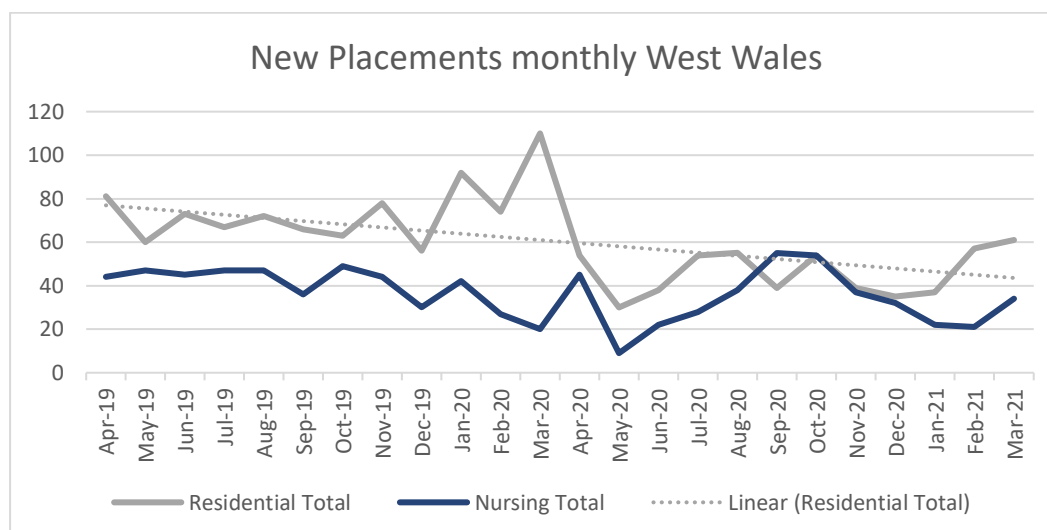

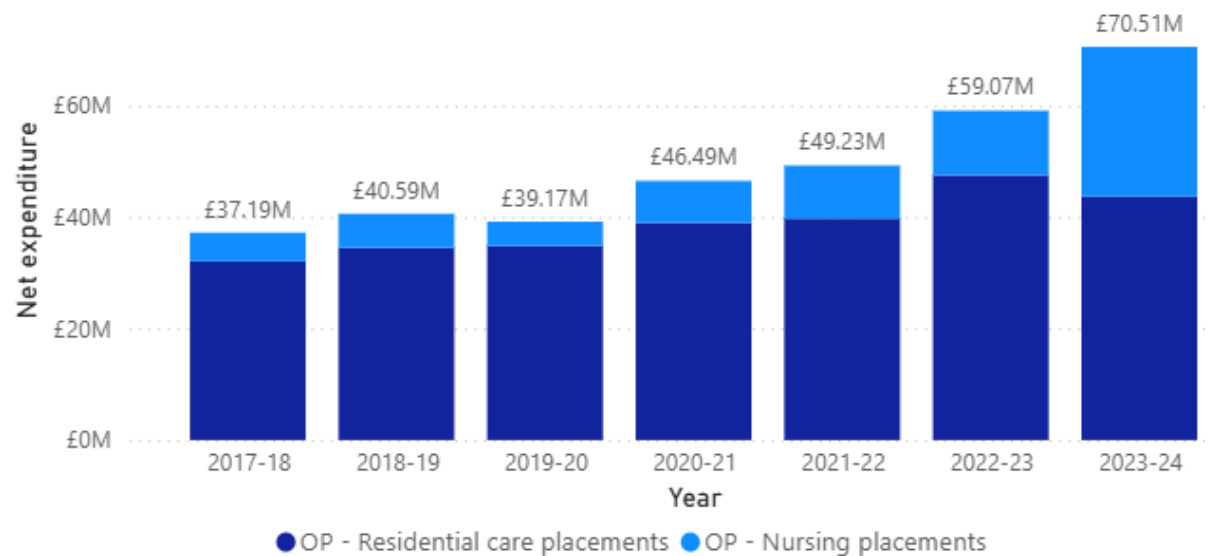

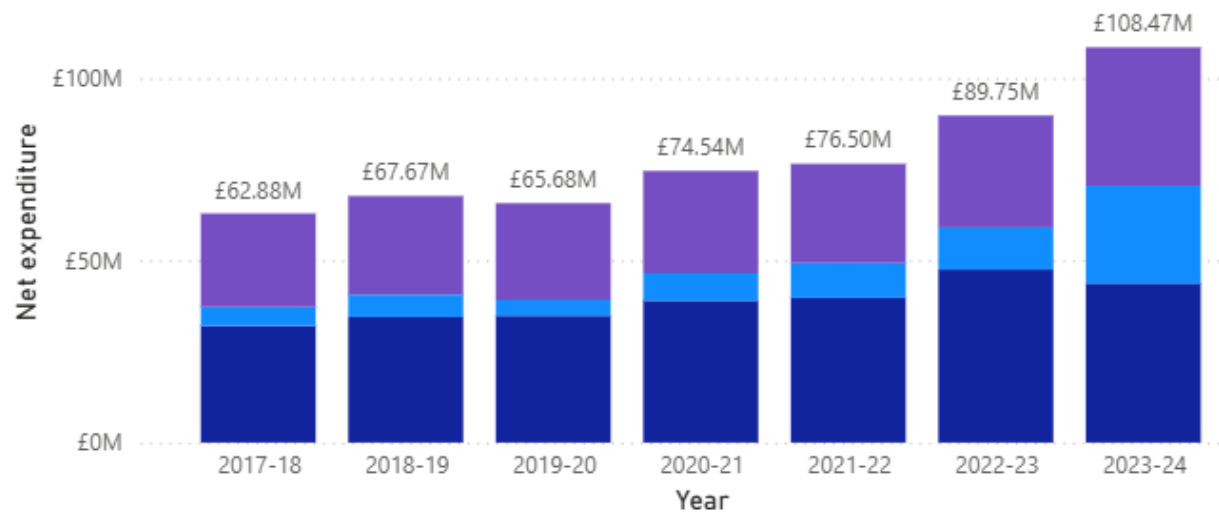

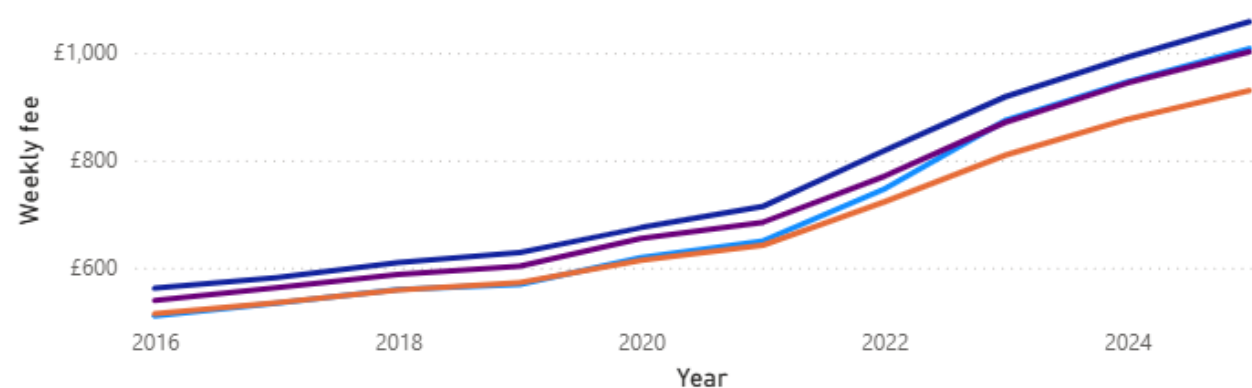

Changes to care home standard weekly rates over the last 10 years

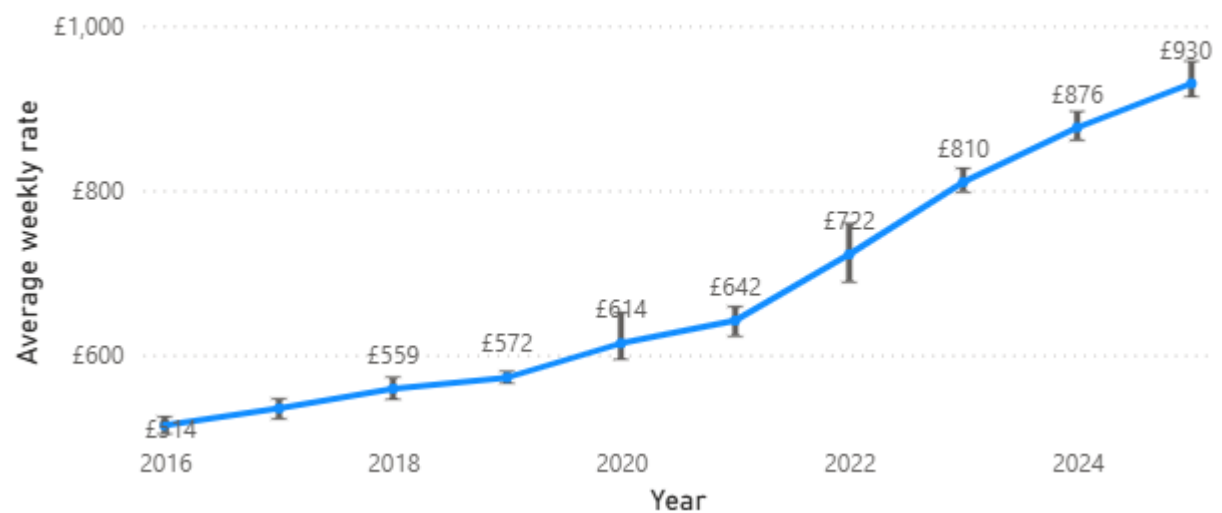
Care home average standard weekly rates by category of care

Category ● Nursing ● Nursing EMI ● Residential ● Residential EMI



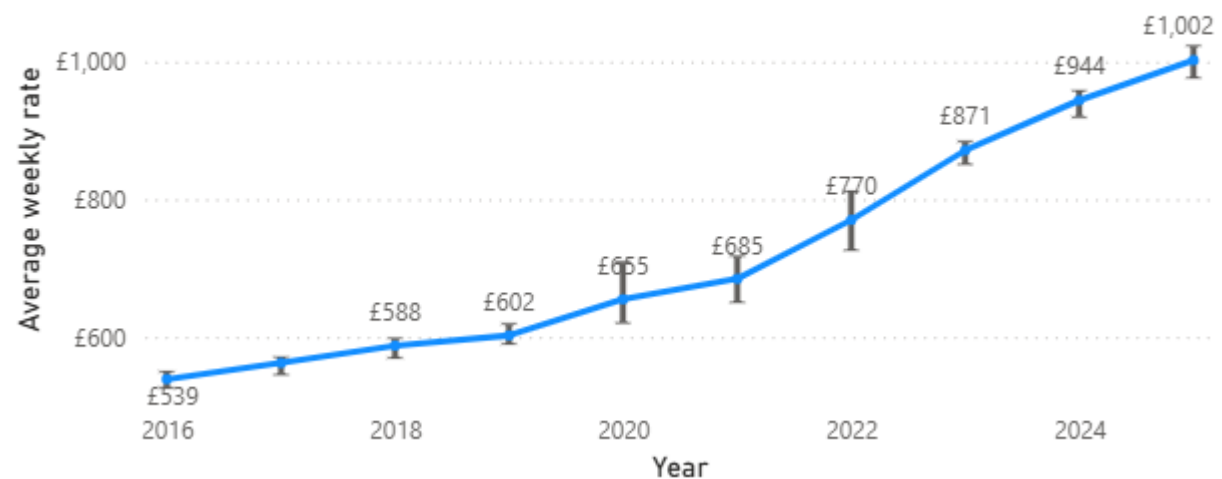

Residential average standard weekly rate



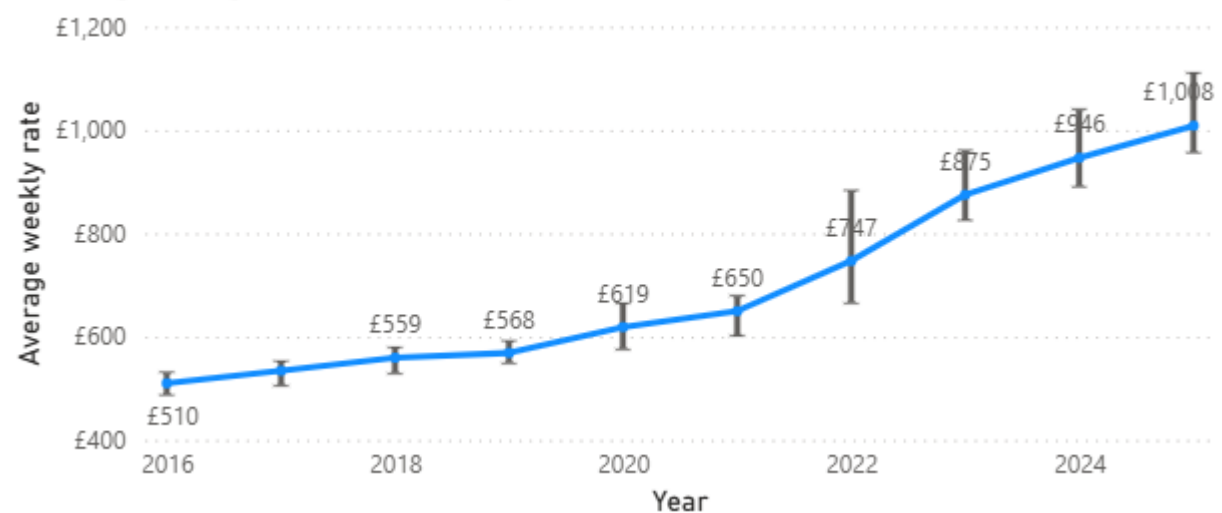

Residential EMI average standard weekly rate



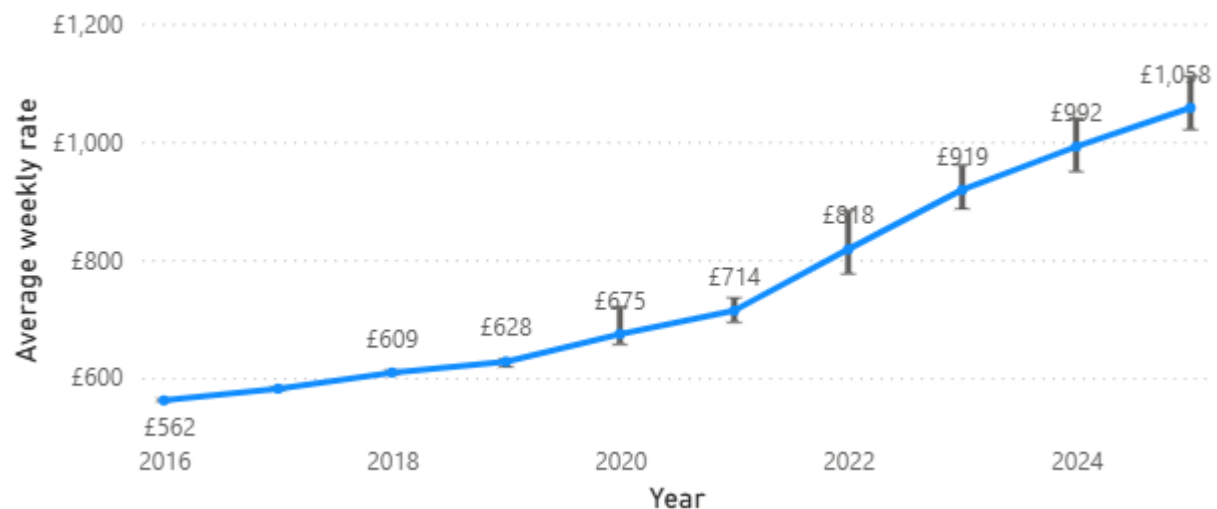

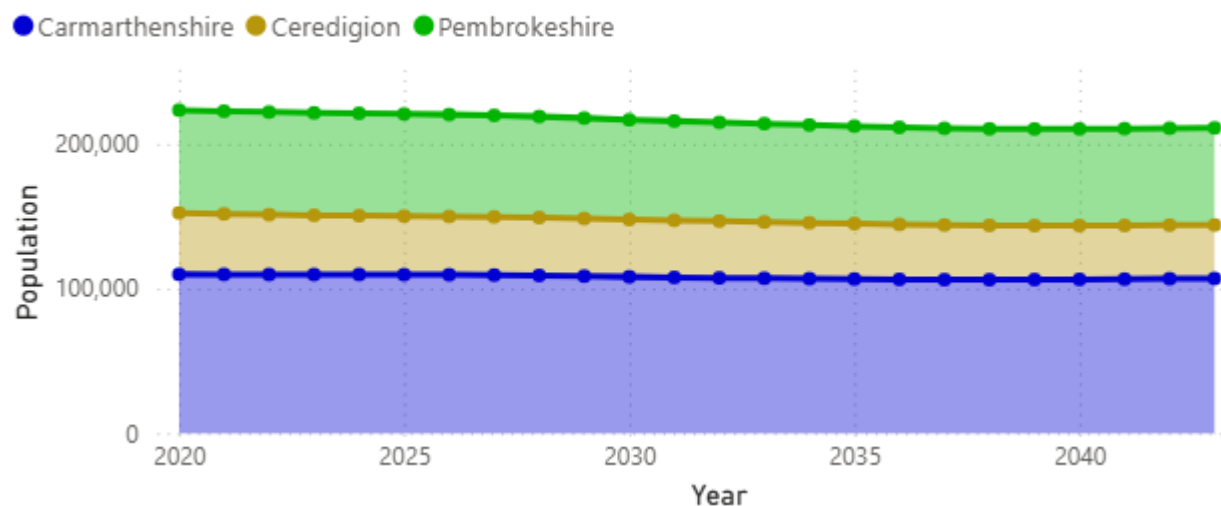

Population projections Working age (16-64)



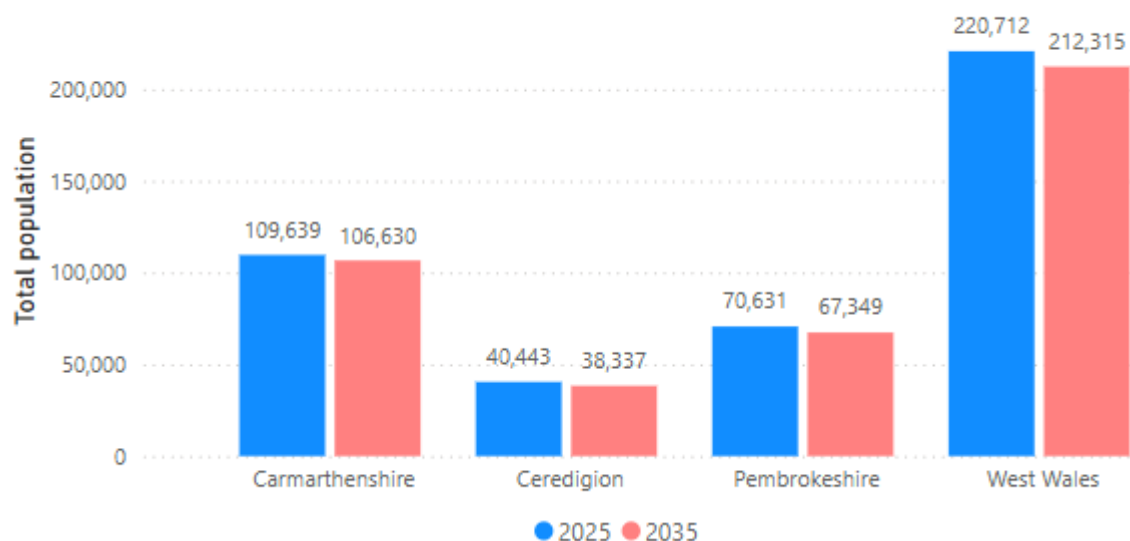

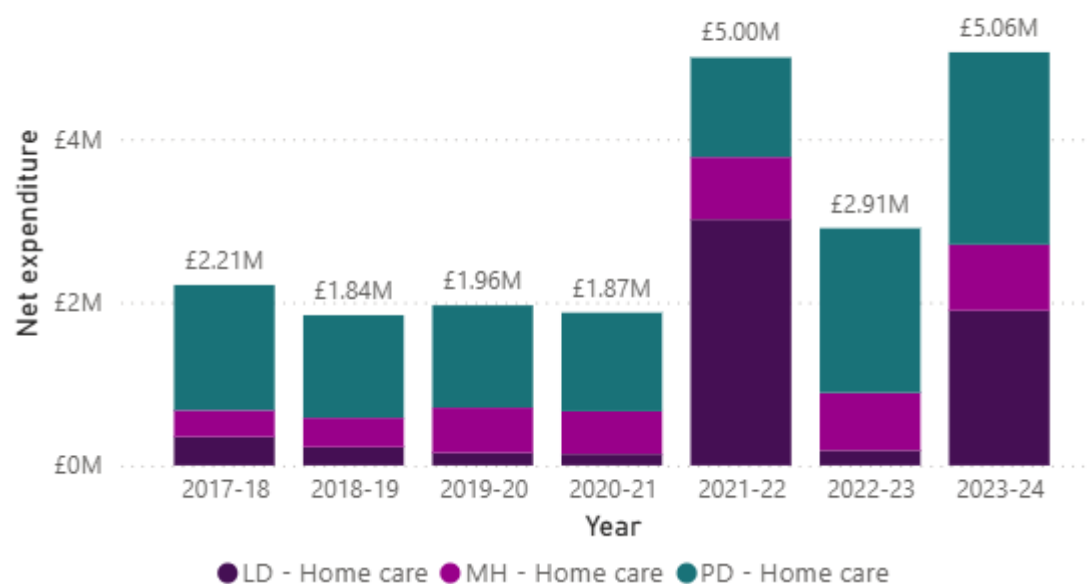

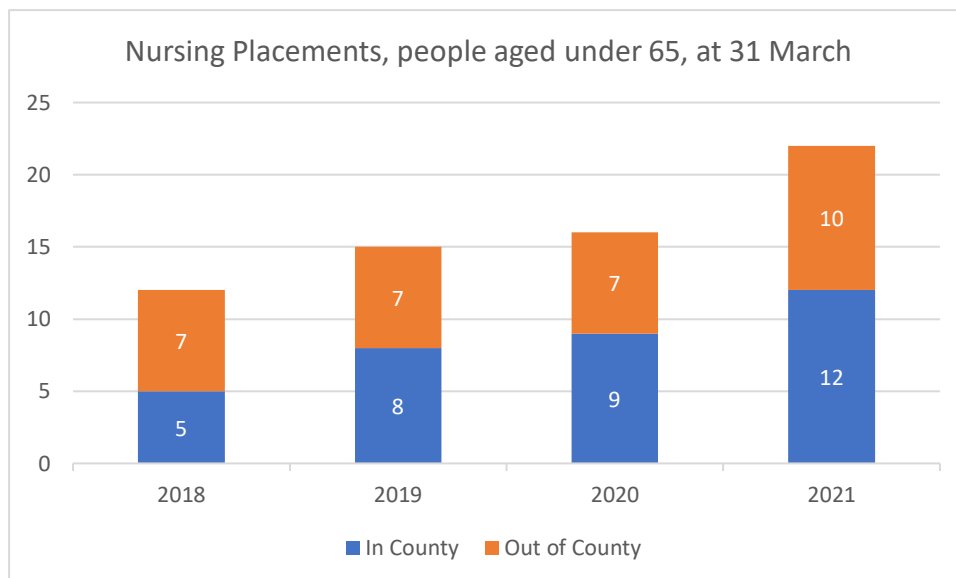

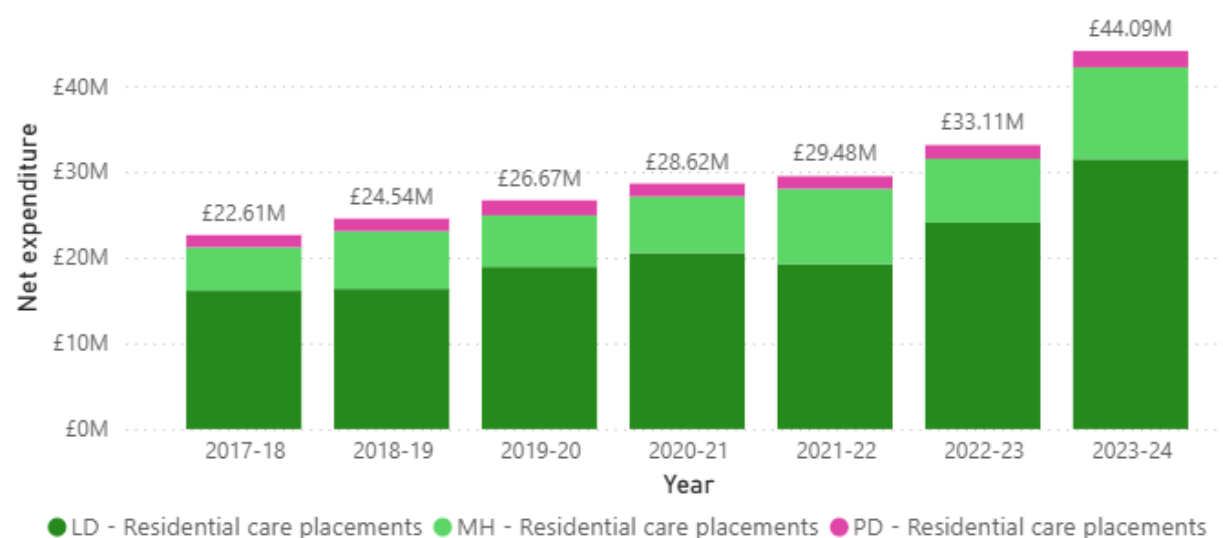

Net expenditure on residential care for working age adults



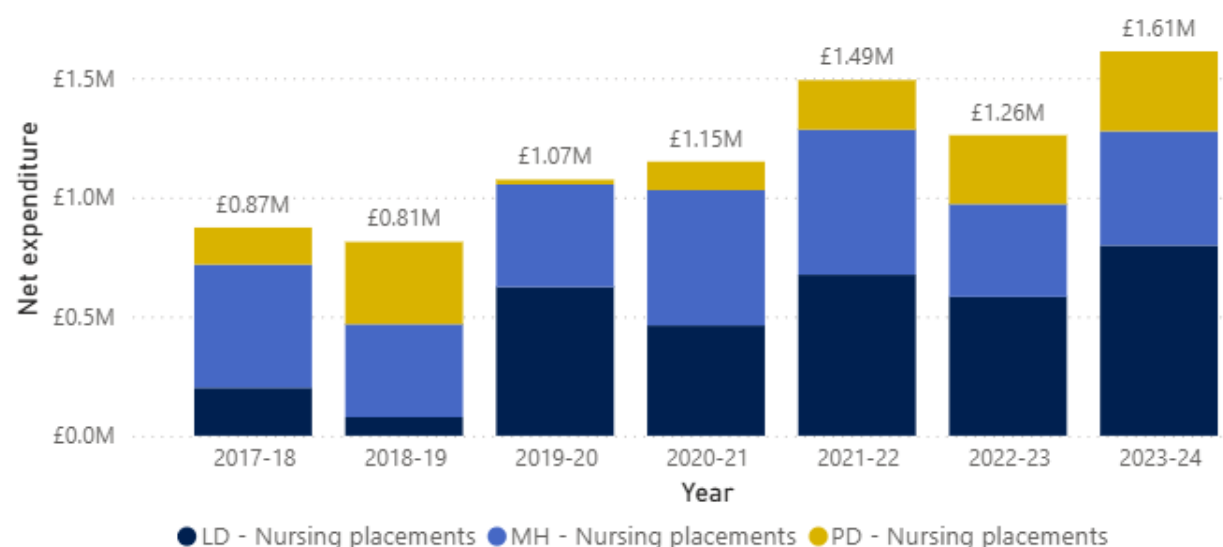

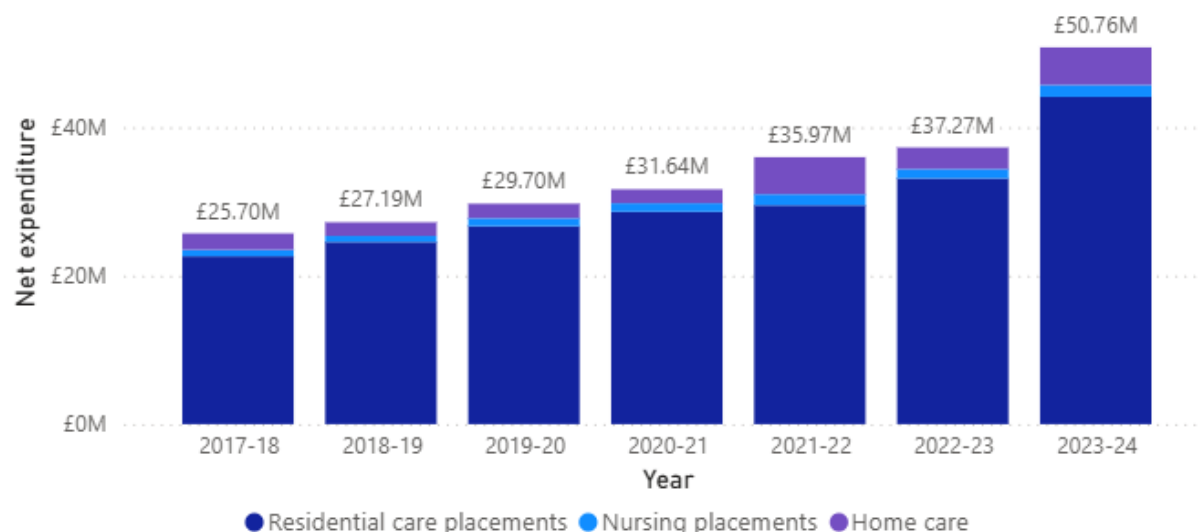

Net expenditure on nursing care for working age adults



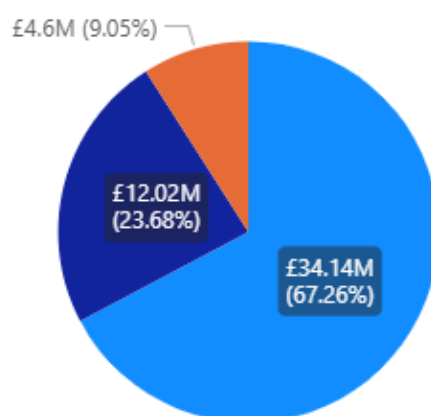

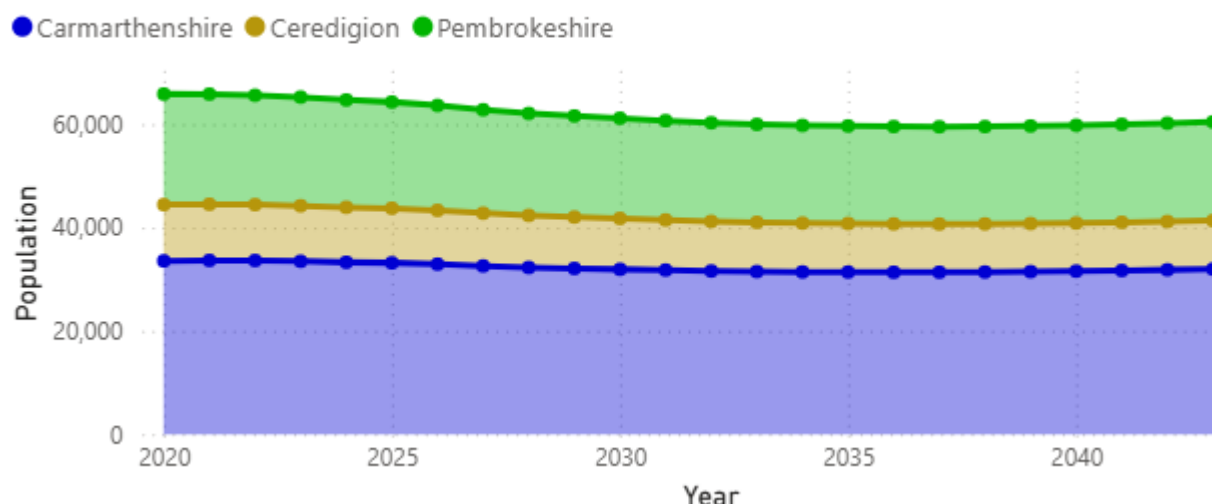

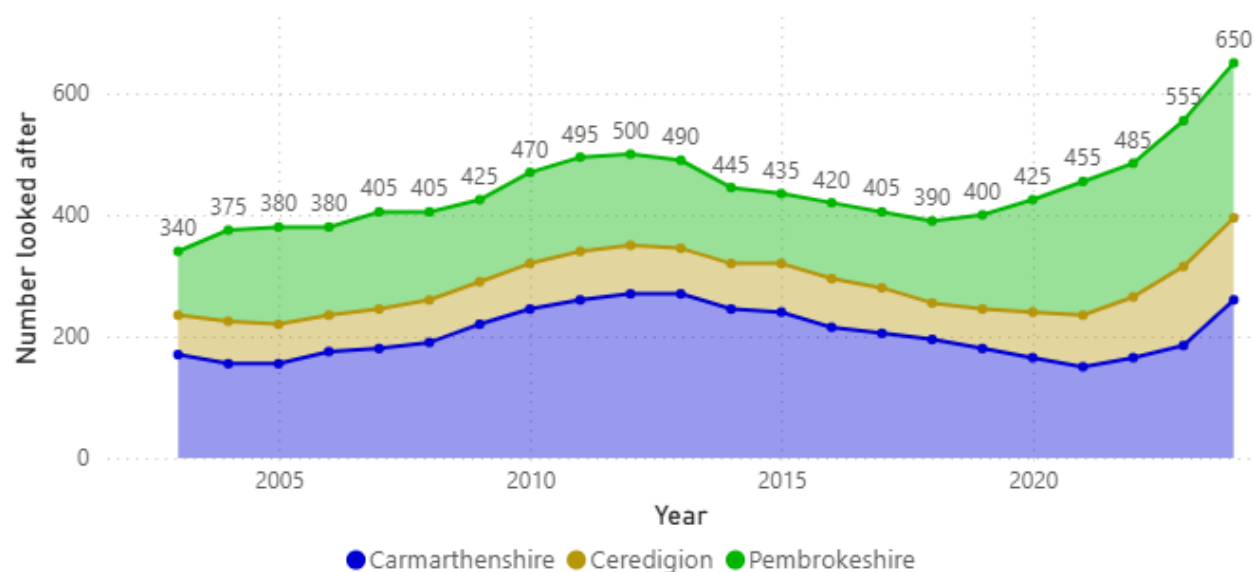

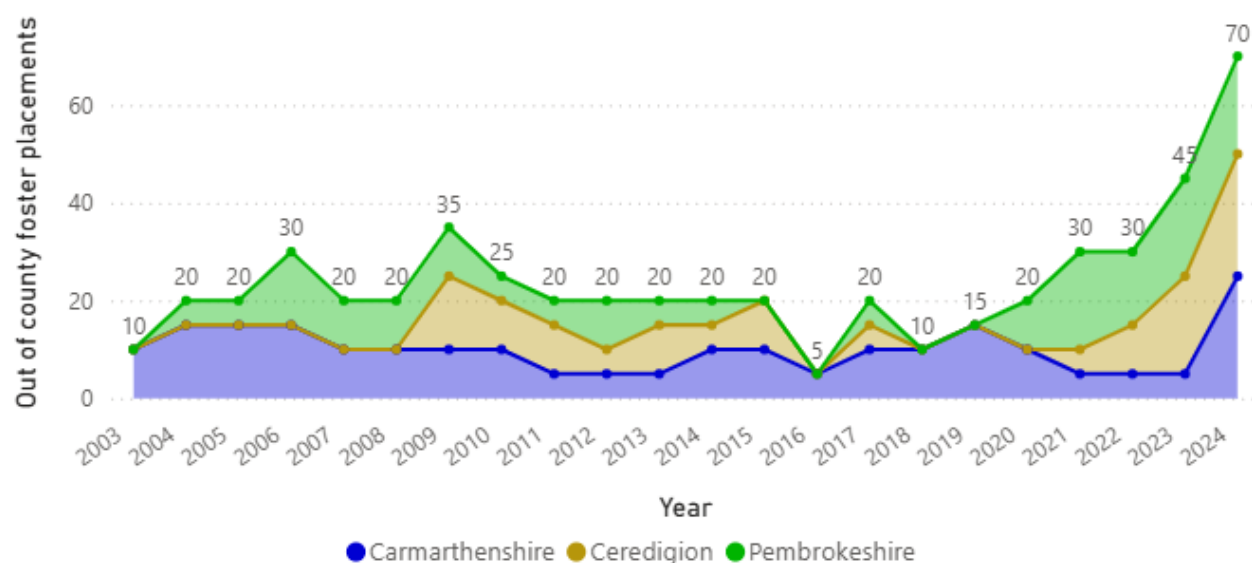

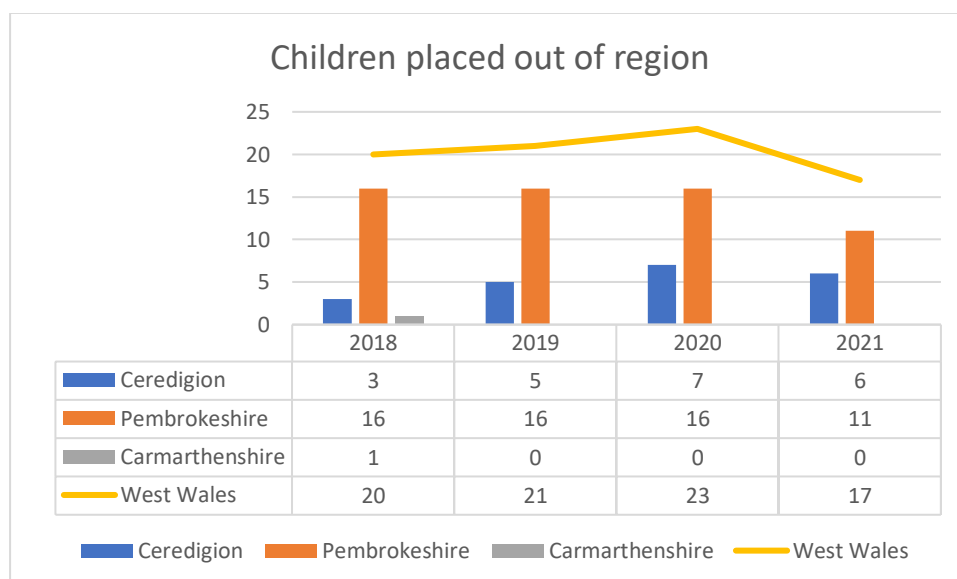

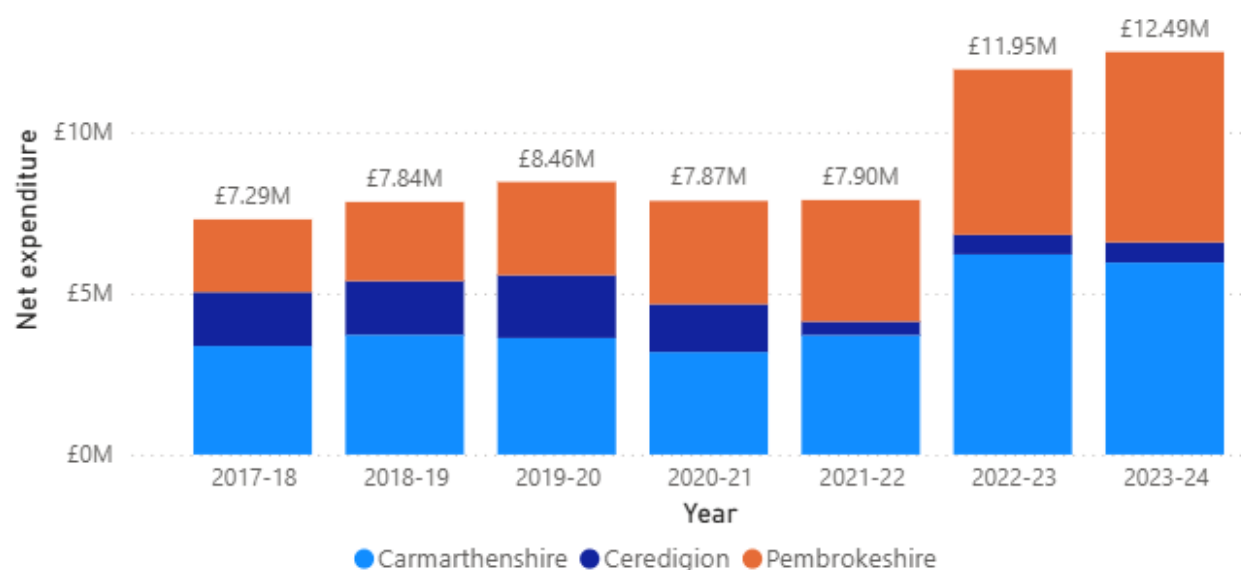

Total net expenditure on children's fostering placements



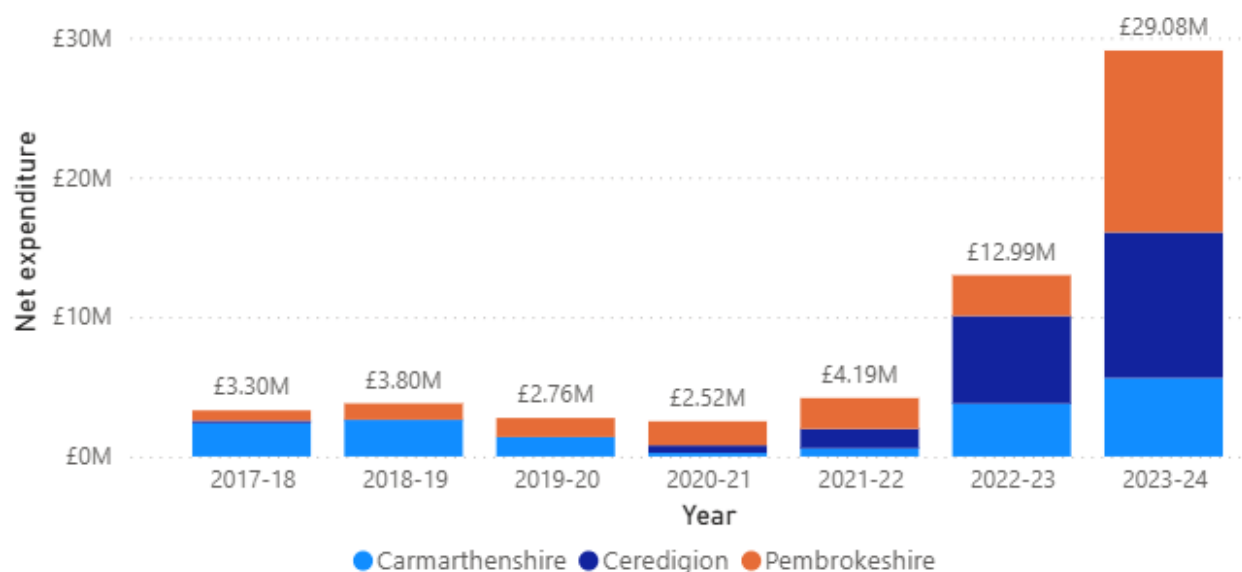
